About the Artists



DOTTIE RANDALL, OPERA San Antonio's Chorus master and pianist, is a native San Antonian. She has also served on the music staff of Chautauqua Opera, and collaborated with opera companies in San Diego, New Orleans, Austin, Des Moines, Orlando and Hawaii Opera, as well as the renowned Arena di Verona in Italy and the American Institute of Musical Studies in Graz, Austria. As an educator, Dottie has worked with singers in the CMI/Opera San Antonio young artist program, and Spotlight on Opera, in addition to maintaining an active vocal coaching studio.



Soprano, ELIZABETH HERLITZ CORTES is the Founder and General Director of the Texas Concert Opera Collective, where she leads artistic collaborations and fundraising initiatives that bring world-class opera to communities across Texas. A dedicated advocate for the arts, she has directed major fundraising efforts for opera companies and cultural organizations, connecting donors, artists, and audiences through the shared power of music. Recent engagements include performances with Opera Philadelphia, Opera San Antonio, Opera Louisiane, and Spotlight on Opera.



This season, mezzo-soprano OLIVIA GRONENTHAL brings her dramatic intensity and vocal agility to the title role of Elizabeth Cree by Kevin Puts and Mark Campbell. Recent performances include Kate Pinkerton in Madama Butterfly with OPERA San Antonio and Austin Opera, and the Super Fan in Nathan Felix's Glory Gone. As a Lakes Area Music Festival resident artist, she covered Hänsel in Hänsel und Gretel and appeared as an orchestral soloist. A fearless interpreter of new and psychologically complex works, she has premiered roles in Anne Frank and New Motive Power and holds degrees from the University of Illinois and Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music.



Soprano, BRITTNEE SIMONE is from Houston, Texas and received both her Bachelors in Music Education and Masters in Vocal Performance at Stephen F. Austin State University. She recently moved to San Antonio where she teaches high school voice lessons. She currently sings with the San Antonio Choral Society, where she was the Messiah Soprano Soloist, and the chorus of Opera San Antonio.
